

## Comparison between First *Korban Pesach* and Second *Korban Pesach*

Ref: *Sefer Korbanot, Hilchot Korban Pesach, Chapter 10*

It is a positive command to offer the *Korban Pesach* on the 14<sup>th</sup> of *Nissan* after midday. If through unfortunate circumstances a person was not able to do *Korban Pesach* on the 14<sup>th</sup> of *Nissan*, he would be able to make it up and bring it on the 14<sup>th</sup> of *Iyar*, one month later.
