Impurity Transmitted to Clothes (Parah Adumah) Ref: Sefer Taharah, Hilchot Parah Adumah, Chapter 5

IMPURITY TRANSMITTED TO CLOTHES (PARAH ADUMAH)

Whenever Torah mentions that garments become impure, it includes any garment or implement that the impure person is touching while he is still in contact with the impurity. When he separates from the impurity, he no longer imparts impurity to his clothes or other objects. This is because he is now regarded as a *rishon* of *tumah*, and a *rishon* does not impart impurity to objects.

There are cases when this impurity can occur even when one is only involved in a procedure. An example of this is *Parah Adumah*.

Similarly, with the Sin Offerings which are burnt i.e. the bulls and goats of *Yom Kippur*, and the sending of goat of *Azazel* to be pushed off the cliff.
