

## Muktzeh (set aside) on Yom Tov

### Ref: Sefer Zemanim, Hilchot Shvitat Yom Tov, Chapter 2

On Yom Tov	“Muktzeh”	Explanation
A pile of ashes made on <i>Yom Tov</i>	×	Rather, it's <i>nolad</i> .
Hatching of chick	✓	Could not know if it would hatch on <i>Yom Tov</i>
Calf born	Sometimes	i.e. if mother hadn't been designated for slaughter. It is different from chick because it is part of the mother
Animals grazing beyond 2000 <i>amah tchum</i>	✓	
<i>Bechor</i> (first born animal) born	✓	A <i>bechor</i> really belongs to Priest and as such could not be slaughtered. If it has a blemish then it could be slaughtered. However, one is not allowed to check for blemishes on <i>Yom Tov</i> .
Domestic animals living at one's home intended for slaughter e.g. chickens, ducks or doves	×	Therefore, can be slaughtered on <i>Yom Tov</i> because in one's mind, they are a possibility to slaughter on <i>Yom Tov</i> .
Wild doves etc. which live close by but are more difficult to capture.	✓	Cannot slaughter on <i>Yom Tov</i> unless designated precisely before Yom Tov.
Fish, beasts etc. which need trapping	✓	Because they have not been designated
Animals which can be caught without a trap	×	
Gentile brings present which was obtained on Yom Tov (food)	✓	If it is clear that the food was obtained before <i>Yom Tov</i> then permitted. Otherwise forbidden.
Branches fallen off a tree	×	These are <i>nolad</i>
Wood set aside for building	✓	Therefore cannot be used for kindling
Wood stored in a private domain	×	And can be used for kindling
Leaves to be used for kindling	✓	Because they can fly away and therefore a person would not have designated them
Earth prepared before <i>Yom Tov</i>	×	Can be used say for covering blood of slaughtered animal or the like
